Both courses will revert to fairway mats on the 1<sup>st</sup> November 2020 and the courses will be played to full length. Winter greens will be in use as and when they are required in order to protect our courses. Winter tees will come into play from the start of January 2021.

## COASTSNAP POST

For those of you who have been playing The 1562 Course, you may have seen a new feature just off to the right of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Tee - this is a CoastSnap Post.



Because of the issues we are having with erosion, the CoastSnap post is part of a project initiated by an Edinburgh based company, JBA Consulting, who is working alongside Angus Council and the Dynamic Coast project, who MGLL is involved with, <http://www.dynamiccoast.com> to monitor shoreline change and erosion in the bay.

In essence it is a community science coastal monitoring approach - pictures taken by the public (or golfers/walkers in our case) are uploaded to a specific Facebook Page and can be analysed to quantify coastal change – <http://www.facebook.com/coastsnap/> - an App is going to be available in due course.
